3. _____ **PERMISSION TO DISPLAY:** The undersigned grant the Member and the U.S. House of Representatives the right to publicly display the art entry, if it is selected for display, in accordance with the rules of the Art Competition, for a period of two years from the latest date on this form.
4. _____ **PERMISSION TO REPRODUCE:** The undersigned also grant the Member, the House, their employees and agents, the United States, and the Congressional Institute, Inc., and its employees, the right to reproduce the art entry for any non-commercial purpose.

Rules and Regulations

FOR STUDENTS AND TEACHERS

General Information

- The competition is open to **high school students only**.
- Each artwork can be no larger in **size** than 26 inches high, 26 inches wide, and 4 inches deep.
- Accepted media for the two-dimensional artwork are as follows:
 - Paintings: oil, acrylics, watercolor, etc.
 - Drawings: colored pencil, pencil, ink, marker, pastels, charcoal
 - Prints: lithographs, silkscreen, block prints
 - Collages
 - Mixed Media
 - Computer-generated art
 - Photographs
- **Deadline: March 29, 2019.** Teachers can arrange for pick up from schools at any point on or before the deadline.
- Each entry must be **original in concept, design, and execution** and may not violate U.S. copyright laws. Any entry that has been copied from an existing photo or image (including a painting, graphic, or advertisement) that was created by someone other than the student is a violation of the competition rules.

Suitability and Content Guidelines

Congressmember Karen Bass welcomes student artwork of all kinds, including those addressing pressing issues of the day.

Student Information and Release Forms

- Each entrant **must** submit a completed **Student Information Release Form** and **Art Competition Entry Form** that is to be signed by the teacher, a parent or guardian, and the student
- A copy of the Student Information Release Form and the Art Competition Entry Form **must be securely attached to the back of the artwork** to certify the originality of the piece.

- Copies of the flyer and the form can be provided in quantity by request.
